
Water Quality Landscape Design Internship

Finding New Ways to Support Local Food Systems

Harvest Pierce County (HPC), a program within Pierce Conservation District, supports a network of over 90 community gardens throughout the county. Recently, HPC hosted a work party at the Salishan community garden, which features rich Cambodian and Vietnamese cultural influences. PCD staff and volunteers moved 15 yards of TAGRO soil, tackling one of the most strenuous steps in growing a garden together. 
